CRVS Assessment and Planning - Where are we now?

More than 50 countries globally with rapid assessments

Category 1 Countries: Countries which have a comprehensive assessment completed, strategic plan advanced, high level political commitment and coordination established and active: 27 countries


Category 2 countries: Countries with comprehensive assessments underway, or which have committed to comprehensive assessments in the immediate future:

Around 16 countries

Category 3 countries: Those remaining countries which have not yet sought a comprehensive assessment: 10 countries

NOTE: these are only the 75 'CoIA' countries. There are more countries with assessments and plans.
